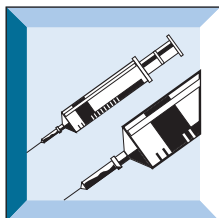


The children who lost the war

Before the war, the mortality rate for children under five was 27.8 deaths per thousand live births. The figure has now increased to 104.4 deaths per thousand live births.



Medical services

Basics such as syringes and needles must be re-used. Acute shortage of nursing staff



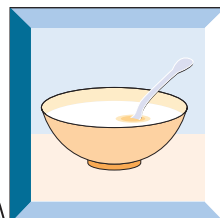
Drugs

Anaesthetics and antibiotics in short supply. Vaccines destroyed by lack of refrigeration.



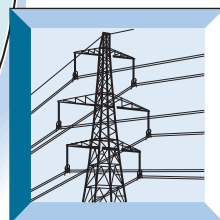
Hygiene

Soap and detergent almost non-existent. Lavatories clogged, no laundry service



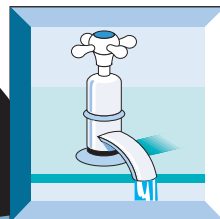
Baby food

Acute shortage. Infant formula costs 2-3,000% more than in August 1990



Electricity supply

Affects refrigeration, heating, water purification, sewage disposal. Neonatal units, X-ray machines, operating theatres barely function



Water supply

60% of homes have no tap water. Public supply contaminated by lack of chlorine
