

# U.N. peace-keepers to go to Yugoslavia

Fifty military observers, two to three officers from each of 21 countries already engaged in U.N. peace-keeping missions, will supervise the latest Yugoslav ceasefire. The officers will be superseded by a 10,000-man U.N. peace-keeping force if the ceasefire holds

The observers will be drawn from three existing missions based in Angola, the Middle East and Iraq/Kuwait
