Twelve new entrants have been accepted into the Rock 'n' Roll Hall of Fame. They were selected by a panel of 600 performers, producers, writers, record executives and broadcasters

Jimmy Hendrix Experience
Comprised of James Marshall
Hendrix and British musicians
Noel Redding and Mitch
Mitchell. Hendrix died of a
drugs overdose in 1970

The Yardbirds
Formed in 1963 in England.
At one time or another Eric
Clapton, Jeff Beck and
Jimmy Page all played
with the group.

Johnny Cash
Influenced country music.

The Isley Brothers
Originally a gospel trio, they
extended into secular music
with 'Shout' in 1959 and 'Twist
and Shout' in 1962.

Sam and Dave
Recorded some of the most vibrant pop
soul records of the 1960s.

Booker T and the MGs
Originally the house band for Stax records.
Bobby 'Blue' Bland, Elmore James and Professor

Longhair
Considered masters of rhythm 'n' blues

Leo Fender
Creator of the Fender guitar.
Doc Pomus Songwriter.
Bill Graham Rock impresario
