Democrats vote in 11 states and Republicans in eight on Super Tuesday.

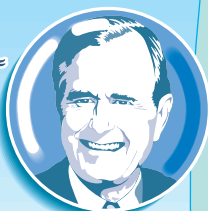
Candidates are fighting for the support of 783 Democratic and 421 Republican delegates. These will eventually choose the party's presidential nominee at the National Conventions in July and August

20 delegates

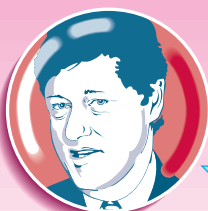


DEMOCRAT SCORECARD:
