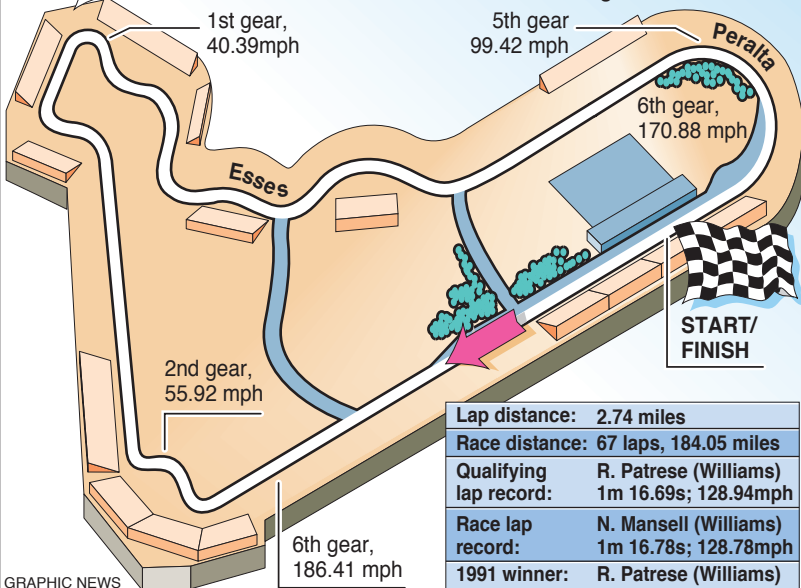


Mexican Grand Prix

Autodromo Hermanos Rodriguez, Mexico City
In the thin air of Mexico City, 7,500ft above sea level, speeds of up to 200mph can be reached on the straight section of the bumpy Rodriguez circuit. Energy-sapping heat and the dusty surface make this one of the most demanding circuits for drivers
