European golfers have won the U.S. Masters at Augusta four times in the last five years but Fred Couples restored national pride in 1992 – becoming the first American to win the coveted Green Jacket since Larry Mize in 1987. 12th hole – Golden Bell (155 yards, par 3)
One of three notorious holes known collectively as Amen Corner. The green is quite wide, but narrow from front to back, guarded by Rae's Creek and surrounded by bunkers.
