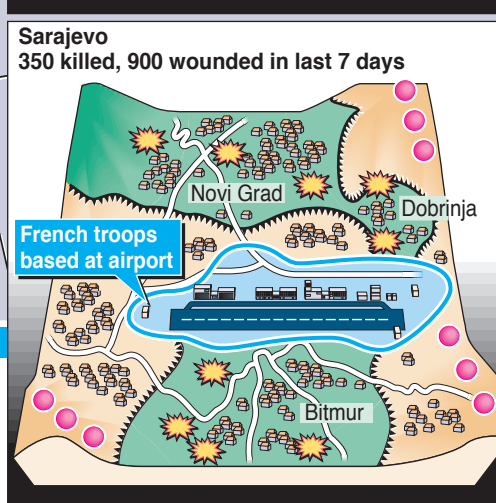
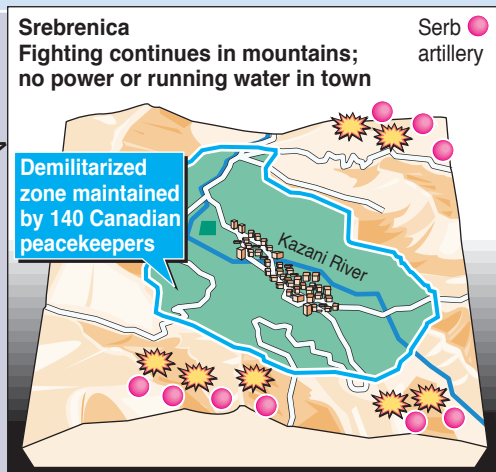


West debates military options

As representatives of the three warring factions gather in Athens to try to reach agreement on the Vance-Owen peace plan, the U.S., UK and France are considering military options to end the war. The talks coincide with renewed aggression by all sides, including heavy shelling of Sarajevo by Bosnian Serbs

Britain: 1,000 troops, Vitez; 900, Tomislavgrad; 250, Gornji Vakuf; 800, Split (Cheshire Rgt due to be replaced by Prince of Wales Own Yorkshire Rgt)
Canada: 1,060 troops plus armoured vehicles, Banja Luka; 140, Srebrenica
France: 1,100 plus helicopters and light armour, Bihac; 800, Sarajevo
Netherlands: 940 plus cargo trucks, Banja Luka and Vitez
Denmark: 151, Kiseljak. **Norway:** 35 engineers, Kiseljak
Portugal: 10 medics, Bihac; **(United States:** 300 strong MASH unit, Zagreb)
