

# The Royal Fleet review

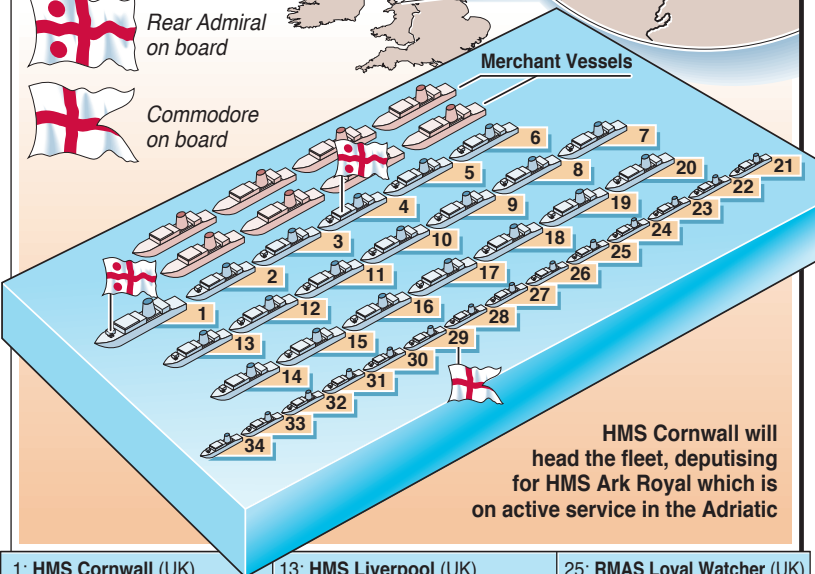
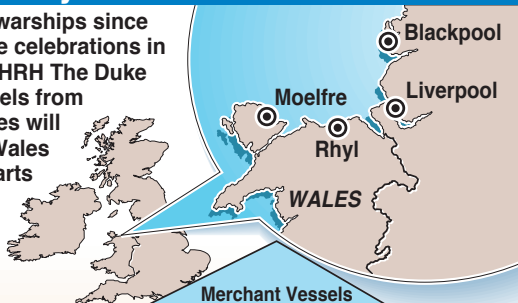
