

# The Open, Royal St George's

Royal St George's, situated on immense sand dunes on the Kent coast and named as England's answer to Scotland's St Andrews, was first selected to stage the Open Championship in 1894, just seven years after the club had been founded. It was the first time the Open had been staged outside Scotland. With its undulating fairways, severe bunkering and prevailing winds, St George's is a classic links course, proving a severe test for even the best golfers
