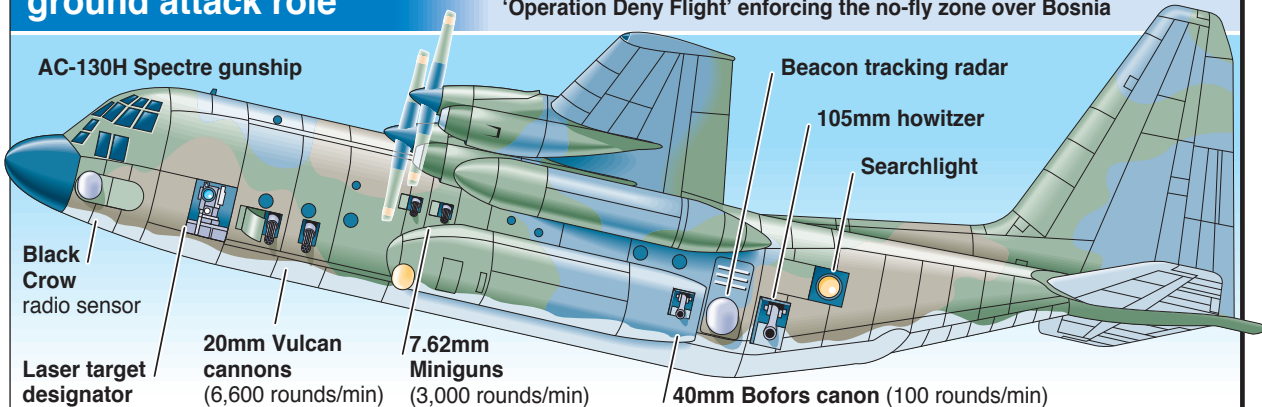

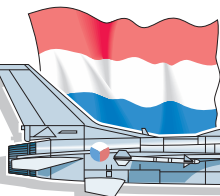
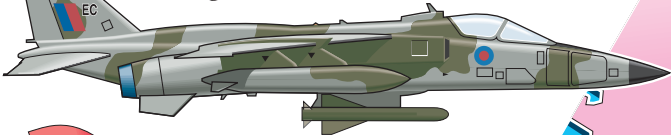
NATO aircraft set for ground attack role

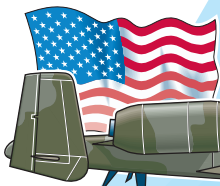
UNITED KINGDOM

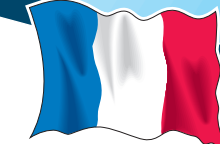
NETHERLANDS

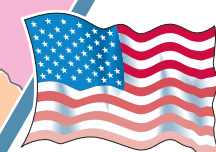

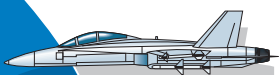
