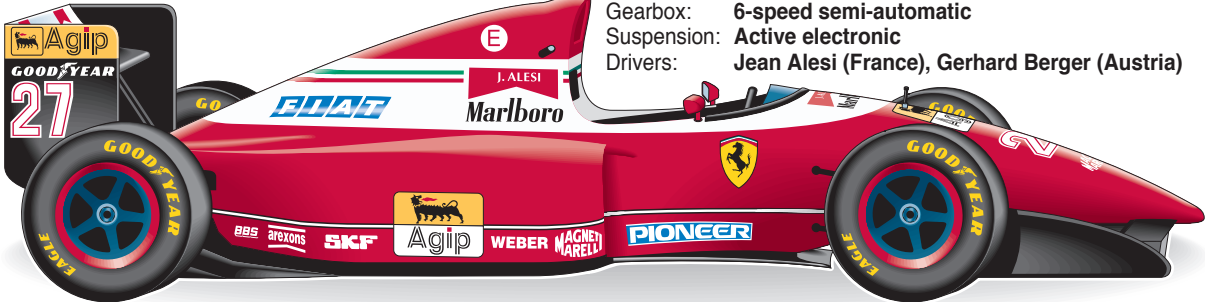

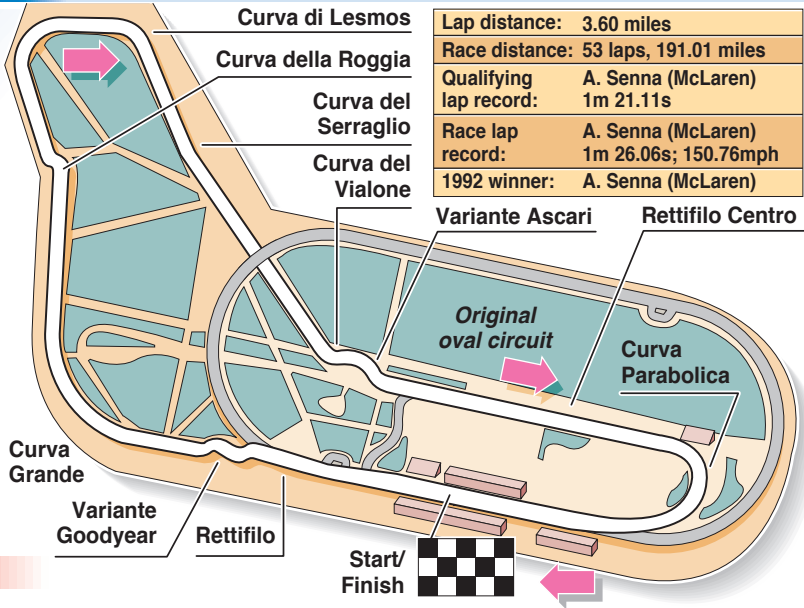
Ferrari – the fallen giants of F1
The most famous and once most feared name in motor racing, Ferrari, have won 102 Grands Prix since their first victory in the 1951 British event. The days of Ferrari dominance – with drivers such as Juan Manuel Fangio and Niki Lauda – are long gone and the most wealthy team in modern racing have scored just nine Grand Prix victories since 1983

Ferrari F93A

Engine: 3497cc Ferrari V-12
Maximum power: Over 700bhp



Speeds in excess of 200mph can be expected on the pit straight at the home of the most passionate crowd on the Grand Prix circuit – the Ferrari-obsessed ‘Tifosi’. The Goodyear and Ascari chicanes were added in an attempt to slow down this exceptionally fast circuit
