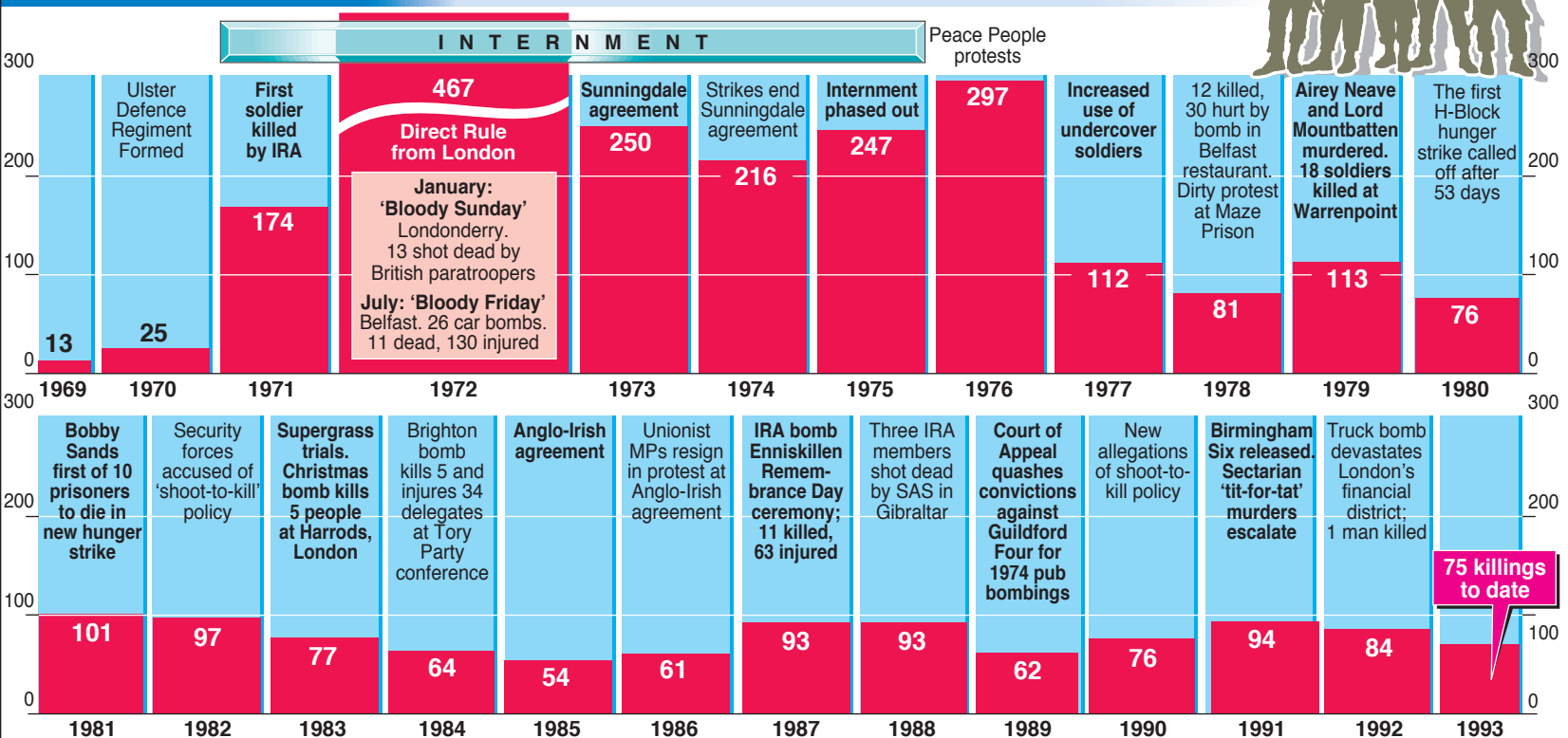


NORTHERN IRELAND

25 years of bloodshed claim over 3,330 lives

A quarter-century of political and sectarian-related conflict in Northern Ireland has claimed more than 3,330 lives since British troops were first deployed in Ulster in August 1969. The troubles have resulted in 3,102 deaths in the province, 119 in mainland Britain, 100 in the Irish Republic and 18 in mainland Europe.
