Education: Spending to rise to
£74bn by 2010/11. Student debt of £6bn to be sold off

NHS: To get an extra £8bn for investment and reform in England



Business: Corporation tax reduced from 30p to 28p from April 2008. Tax on small business raised to 22p in the pound by 2009. Small businesses to get up to £3,000 for training jobless young people. Extra £6bn to help people with bankrupt pension schemes



Homes: Capital gains tax allowance up from £8,800 to £9,200 this year. Allowance for married couples doubled. **Zero carbon** homes up to £500,000 in value to be exempt from stamp duty until 2012. Insulation grants worth up to £4,000 to be offered to pensioners



Defence: Extra £86m for security and counter-terrorism measures. Extra £400m for military operations in Iraq and Afghanistan



VAT: To be cut from 17.5% to 5% on environmental products for the home; building alterations to help elderly; and anti-smoking aids such as nicotine replacement products

Savings: Amount saved in a Cash ISA up 20% to £3,600
