

Fund to become 'living memorial'

Trustees of the controversial charitable fund set up after the death of Princess Diana say they want it to be her 'living memorial' and to continue indefinitely, attracting annual donations of around £5 million. The fund – used to help those in need and distress – has now raised £80 million
