

U.S. strike aimed at terror bases

Lightning U.S. cruise missile strikes damaged a remote Afghan 'terrorist university' and a Sudan pharmaceutical plant, alleged to be capable of producing deadly VX nerve gas. The attacks, using 75 to 80 missiles fired from ships, were intended to reduce the power of Saudi financier Osama bin Laden – suspected mastermind of the U.S. embassy bombings in Africa
