

Road to the White House starts here

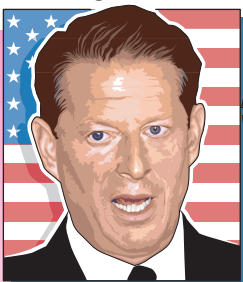
