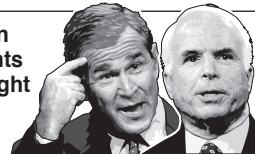


Crunch time in race for the White House

The battle between GOP candidates George W. Bush and John McCain – who has so far attracted Democrats and independents as well as Republican voters – could be determined on the night of *Super Tuesday*. McCain faces a hard fight in five “closed” states* where only registered Republicans may vote

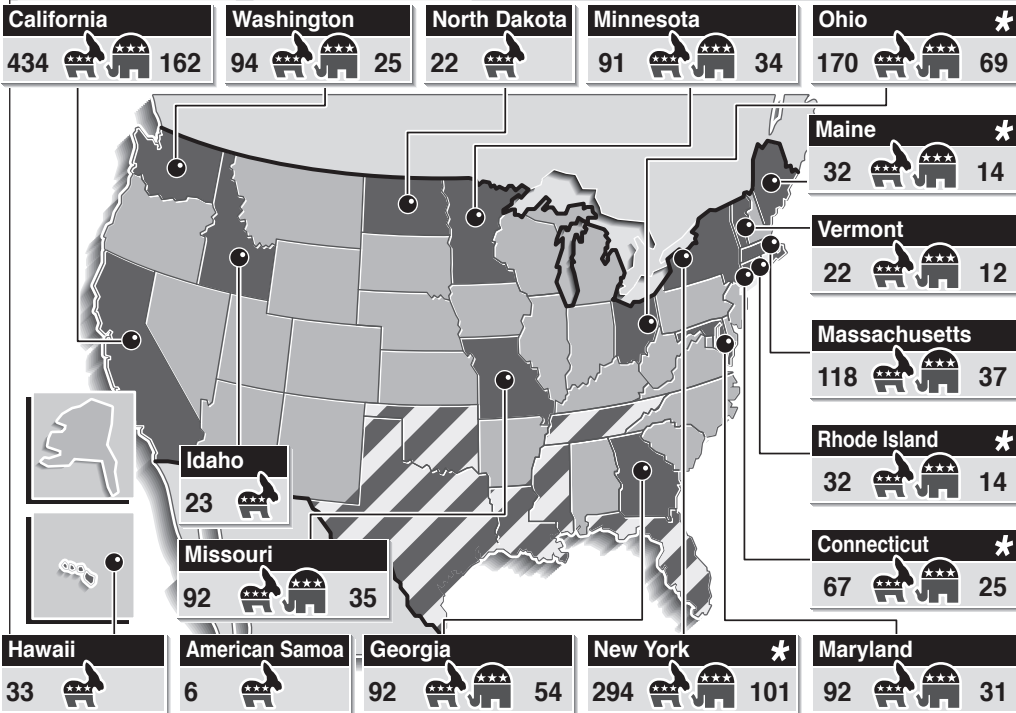
