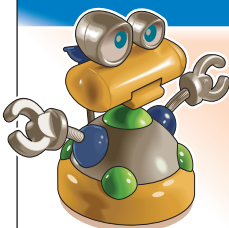


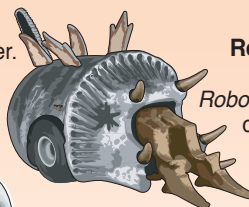
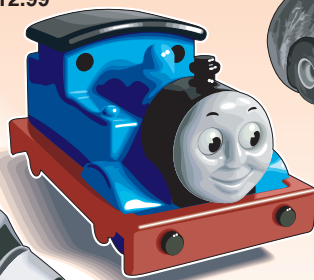
Hot toys on every kid's wishlist

For the first time ever, Thomas and his friends actually talk to each other. From £12.99

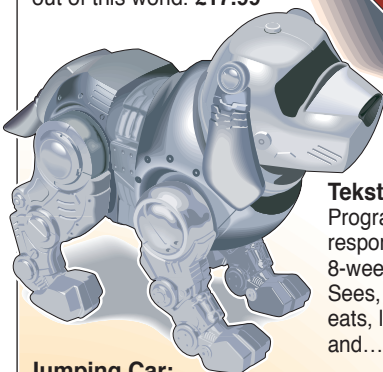


Ready to rumble:

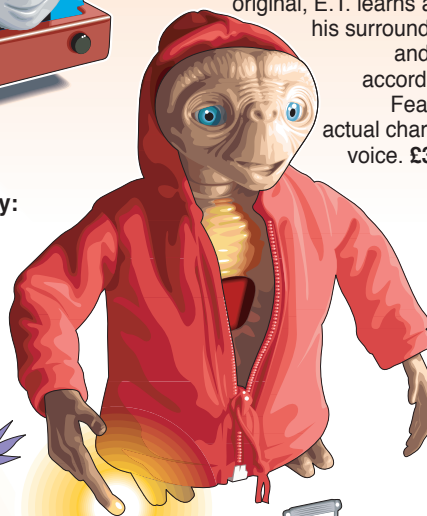


Lego Time:

Snap-on colour links allow you to create hundreds of looks from one watch. From £29.99



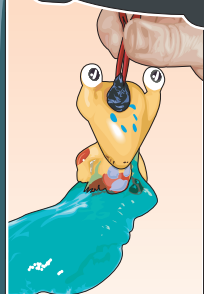
Interactive E.T.: Just like the original, E.T. learns about his surroundings and acts accordingly. Features actual character voice. £34.99

Alternative alarm clock. Record your favourite sound and have it wake you every morning. £14.99

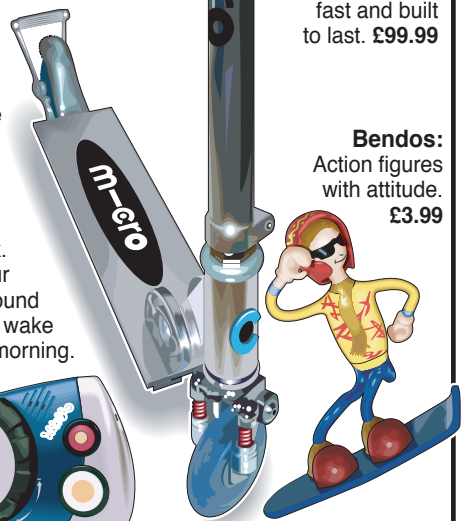


Martians Brainz:
