

Inestimable costs at "Ground Zero"

When terrorists slammed hijacked airplanes into the World Trade Center many foreign nationals working in the twin towers died along with their American colleagues. More than 5,000 people are still missing and over 400 – including 266 aboard the planes – are now confirmed dead
