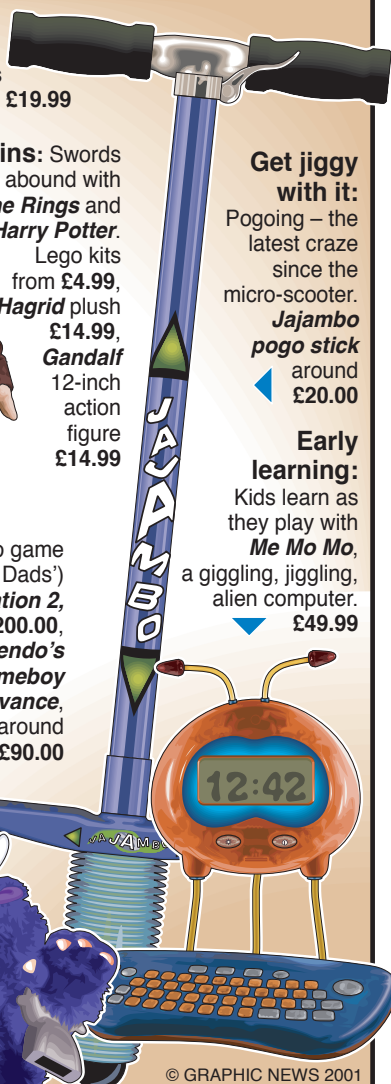
## Split personality:
