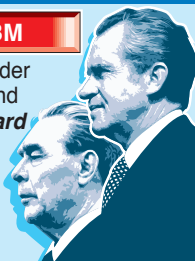


Arms agreements between U.S. and Russia

1972: SALT I, ABM

Signed by Soviet leader **Leonid Brezhnev** and U.S. president **Richard Nixon**. **Salt I** sets ceiling on strategic nuclear weapons. **ABM** limits national missile defences



1993: START II

Signed by Bush and Russian President **Boris Yeltsin**. Reduces nuclear warheads to 3,000 to 3,500 each. Ratified by Senate in 1996, by Duma in 2000. Yet to go into effect



1979: SALT II

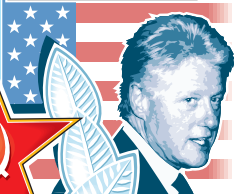
Never ratified

1987: INF



Signed by U.S. president **Ronald Reagan** and Soviet president **Mikhail Gorbachev**.

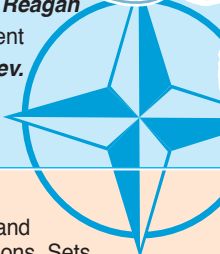
Bans ground-launched, medium-range nuclear missiles



Signed by **President Bill Clinton** and leaders of other nuclear powers. Bans nuclear weapons tests. Rejected by U.S. Senate in 1999

May 24, 2002

President George W. Bush and Russian President **Vladimir Putin** sign treaty to reduce numbers of nuclear warheads to about 2,000 each



1990: CFE

Signed by **NATO** and **Warsaw Pact** nations. Sets limits of Conventional Forces in Europe

1991: START I

Signed by **President**

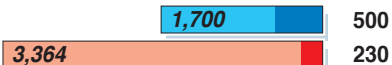
George Bush and Gorbachev. Reduces nuclear warheads to about 6,000 each, down 25-35%. Went into effect December 1994



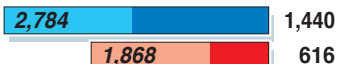
U.S.: 2002 2012
