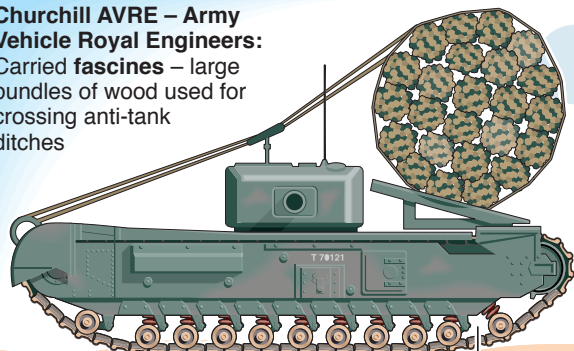


"Hobart's Funnies" – "weapons of the 79th Armoured Division"

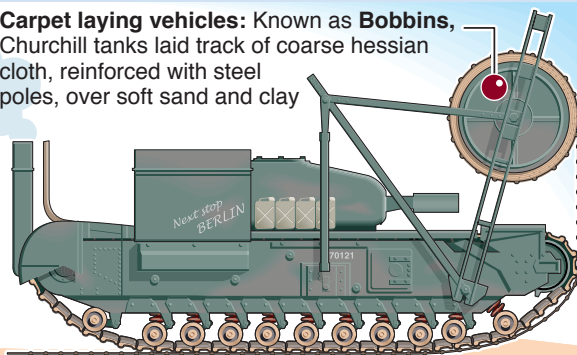
Churchill AVRE – Army Vehicle Royal Engineers:

Carried **fascines** – large bundles of wood used for crossing anti-tank ditches



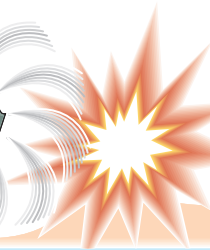
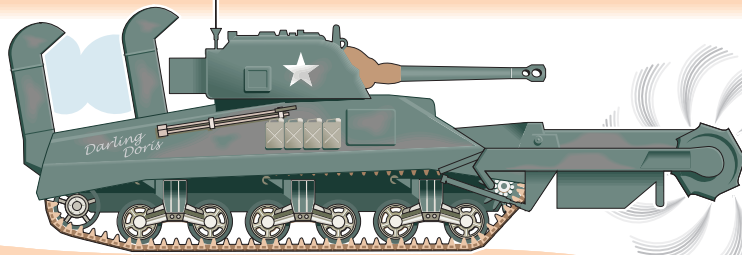
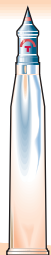
Carpet laying vehicles: Known as **Bobbins**,

Churchill tanks laid track of coarse hessian cloth, reinforced with steel poles, over soft sand and clay



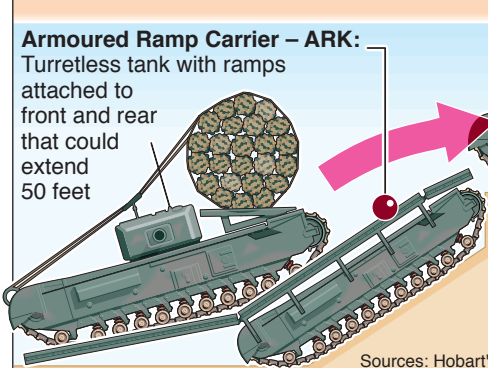
Sherman M4: Sherman Crab

cleared path through minefield by flailing ground with chains ending in fist-sized steel balls. Main gun fired 17-pounder armour-piercing shell

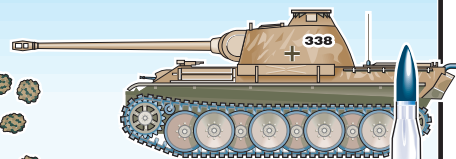


Armoured Ramp Carrier – ARK:

Turretless tank with ramps attached to front and rear that could extend 50 feet



Vehicles rolled up one set of ramps, across flat top of ARK to scale obstacles such as seawalls



German Panzer tank:

Most powerful tank in service. Main armament: 75mm gun firing KwK-42 armour-piercing shell
