

Operation Sorbus security at Gleneagles

Police have mounted a \$180 million security operation to seal the world's eight most powerful leaders from the outside world during their three-day G8 summit at Gleneagles. Since the chaotic Genoa summit four years ago, which left one protestor dead and 650 others injured, G8 summits have been hosted in easily-isolated locations

SECURITY MEASURES

Police: Up to 3,000 officers, with armed patrols

Roads closed: Local access only

Spy in the sky: Airship with infra-red CCTV

Protestors allegedly plan to block A9 and other key roads

Golf course: \$1.8m, 5-mile steel perimeter fence, rights of way closed

Residents issued with ID cards

Police at junctions

Lowered speed limit

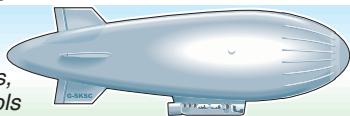
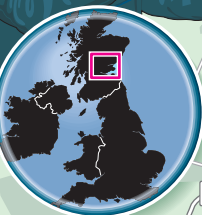
