

Gaza Strip disengagement plan

Thirty-seven years after Israeli forces swept into Gaza and the West Bank during the Six-Day War of 1967, settlers are to be removed from 21 Gaza settlements that house some 8,500 Israelis. Israel is also dismantling four small settlements, home to another 675 people, in the northern West Bank
