

CIA accused of outsourcing torture

The U.S. has been using a network of covert prison camps – called “black sites” – in eight countries to detain suspected terrorists at various times since 2001. Run by the CIA, and known as “extraordinary rendition”, captives are flown to countries where torture is often used in interrogation
