

Ukraine gas dispute threatens EU supplies

The price dispute between Russia's state-controlled energy giant, Gazprom, and the Ukraine has raised concerns that European supplies could be affected. Gazprom supplies 25% of the gas consumed in the EU and some 80% of that amount is sent in pipelines that cross Ukraine

Britain: Running out of gas from North Sea fields – imports gas from Belgium. Gas reserves: **14 days**

Italy: Gazprom supplies 29% of its gas. Reserves: **15 days**

Ukraine: Gazprom has raised prices from \$50 to \$230 per 1,000 cubic metres. **Kiev says it will siphon off gas if temperature falls below -3°C**
