Key players in Islamic militant Hamas







- 1 Khaled Mashal, late 40s: Physics teacher and supreme leader of Hamas. Currently living in exile in Damascus, Mashal succeeded Ahmed Yassin and Abdel Aziz Rantisi who were both assassinated by Israel in 2004. Alleged mastermind of group's terrorist attacks against Israel. Mashal took part in ceasefire talks with Israel in 2004
- 2 Dr Mahmoud al-Zahar, 60: Hardline leader of Hamas in Gaza. Surgeon and former personal doctor to Yassin, al-Zahar was severely injured in airstrike on his home in 2003 in which his son was killed. Could become Hamas' first Prime Minister

3 Ismail Haniya: Presented Hamas' public face on TV during campaign. Was expelled from Palestinian territories to Lebanon in 1992. Regarded as pragmatic leader, he has acted as go-between with Fatah and Palestinian Authority. A leading candidate for Prime Minister

Others Said Siyam: Believed to be group's third most senior figure in Gaza with control over contact between Hamas, Fatah and *Islamic Jihad*

Hassan Yousef, 50: Also known as **Abu Masab**. The moderate leader of Hamas in West Bank was former head of **Zakat** – charity at al-Quds University
