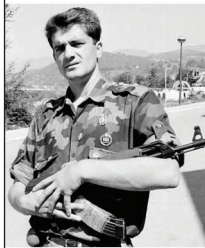


Yugoslav war crimes suspects

Bosnian Serb war crimes suspect Milan Lukic, accused of some of the worst atrocities of the Bosnian war, has been handed over to the Yugoslav war crimes tribunal in The Hague



Milan Lukic, 38

Arrested in August 2005 in Buenos Aires, Lukic stands accused by UN prosecutors of participating in murders of more than 100 Bosnian Muslims during early 1990s

Radovan Karadzic, 60

Former Bosnian Serb leader is one of world's most wanted men for allegedly instigating 1995 Srebrenica massacre in which 7,500 Muslim men and boys died

Ratko Mladic, 62

Karadzic's army chief throughout 1992-95 Bosnian war. Still at large, he is charged with crimes against humanity for leading Bosnian Serb forces which overran Srebrenica

Slobodan Milosevic, 64

Former President of Serbia has been on trial since 2002 for alleged crimes including genocide committed in Bosnia, Croatia and Kosovo in 1990s

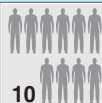
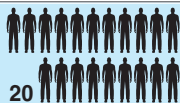
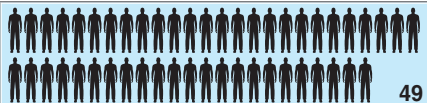
The Hague tribunal has indicted 161 people for violations of international humanitarian law in the former Yugoslavia

Still at large

At or awaiting transfer to UN detention unit in The Hague

Case transferred to other country for trial
