- Sep 29, 1951: Veronica Michelle Bachelet born in Santiago
- 1973: President
 Salvador Allende
 killed in military coup.
 Bachelet's father
 Alberto detained
 and tortured by
 military junta, later
 dies of a heart attack
- 1975: Michelle Bachelet and her mother kidnapped, tortured and then exiled to Australia. They settle in East Germany, where she

qualifies as a paediatrician

1979: Bachelet returns to Chile, still in iron grip of dictator General Augusto Pinochet

LOONDE ESTAN

■ 1986-1990: Works secretly as a human rights activist helping children of the tortured and disappeared

- 1990: Democracy restored in Chile
- 1994-1997:
 Bachelet, a lifelong socialist, works for democratic government as adviser to undersecretary of health
- 1996: Loses bid to become mayor of Santiago suburb Las Condes, but wins praise for her political savvy
- **2000:** As health minister, she begins thorough reform of

Chile's antiquated system

- **2002:** As one of world's few female defence ministers, Bachelet's profile begins to soar. She resigns her post and begins campaign for presidency
- Jan 15, 2006: Bachelet defeats closest rival in a run-off poll, becoming Latin America's first directly elected woman leader
