

Kadima claims victory in Israeli election

Acting Prime Minister Ehud Olmert's new centrist Kadima party has taken the largest share of parliamentary seats in Israel's 120-member Knesset. Former Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's right-wing Likud – the party that dominated Israel for decades – was beaten into fifth place
