World Cup drama beyond the final whistle

The original trophy survived World War II hidden under a bed in Italy. Stolen in England before the 1966 tournament, it was found in a rubbish heap by a dog called *Pickles* – only to be stolen again in Brazil in 1983

JULES RIMET TROPHY 1930-1970

Gold-plated sterling silver with semi-precious lapis lazuli base. Height 35cm Weight 3.8kg

Created by French sculptor **Abel LaFleur** and named after FIFA president who founded the tournament

Brazil won the trophy outright after their third success – a 4-1 victory over Italy in 1970

Stolen in 1983, the Brazilian F.A. replaced it with a duplicate. The original is thought to have been melted down THE WORLD CUP 1974-

18-carat solid gold with two layers of semi-precious malachite. Height 36cm Weight 6.175kg

Italian sculptor Silvio Gazzaniga's design was chosen from 53 submissions

West Germany were the first champions to hold it aloft, in 1974

Winners' names engraved on underside of base. No country can win it outright

Trophy remains in FIFA's possession – winners receive gold-plated replica
