

The sudden recovery of a French nun suffering from Parkinson's disease is at the heart of proceedings which could lead to the canonisation of John Paul II. Pope Benedict XVI has waived the customary five-year waiting period to start the process leading to beatification, following public calls to name him a saint as soon as possible

Jun: Monsignor Slawomir Oder (below) - postulator spearheading John Paul's cause - receives letter from


community of French nuns saying that after praying to late pontif to cure a nun sufferina from extreme Parkinson's disease, the woman is miraculously cured

Jun 19: Vatican launches web site to collect evidence "in favour or against" John Paul's reputation for holiness

Jun 28: John Paul's beatification cause officially opens - officials take oath promising to keep testimony of witnesses secret

Dec 6: Eleven dissident theologians appeal against beatification. They cite John Paul's rigidly conservative stand on issues such as contraception. limitations on role of women, sexual abuse scandals in the Church, and Vatican's "murky" financial deals with Italy's Banco Ambrosiano, which

went bankrupt in 1982 owing \$1.287bn. Bank chairman Roberto Calvi (right) dubbed God's Banker - fled Italy and was later found hanging from Blackfriars Bridge in London



Jan 31: Msgr. Oder announces official inquiry into possible French miracle

NEXT STEPS ON ROAD TO SAINTHOOD

- 1. Venerable. If a miracle is verified to have occurred after his death. John Paul will be declared Venerable
- 2. Blessed. Theologians will vote on soundness of faith and reputation for holiness. If favourable, John Paul will be declared Blessed of the Church
- 3. Sainthood. Declared if second miracle is attributed to John Paul
