▲ 1945: Celebrations took place across Europe and the U.S. to mark the defeat of Nazi forces

1794: Antoine-Laurent Lavoisier, the French chemist who identified oxygen, was guillotined in Paris by the Revolutionary Convention

1924: Afrikaans became the official language of South Africa

1984: The Thames Barrier in London, constructed to stem the flow of the tidal river and prevent flooding, was opened

2003: At least 33 elderly German tourists died when an express train ploughed into their bus on a rail crossing in central Hungary
