

Pressure mounts on Iran to accept offer

As the UN atomic agency meets to search for a way to persuade Iran to stop uranium enrichment, pressure is growing on Tehran to respond to a package of incentives put forward by six major powers which may allow Iran to enrich uranium at some point in the future

INCENTIVES



Iran to acquire light-water reactors

To be allowed domestic nuclear fuel programme after open-ended halt to enrichment work – probably lasting years – and under full IAEA inspection



Iran to have legally binding guarantees of nuclear fuel – including partnership in fuel centre in Russia and establishment in Iran of facility containing five-year fuel stockpile



Creation of framework for increased direct investment and trade – including removal of restrictions on aircraft makers like **Boeing** and **Airbus** on sales of civilian aircraft to Iran



Support for Iran's membership of World Trade Organisation

Iran offered U.S. security guarantees

THREAT OF SANCTIONS



Suspension of Iran's technical nuclear cooperation with IAEA

Embargo on export of nuclear goods to Iran



Freeze on assets of Iranian financial institutions and of specific individuals and organisations

Ban on investment in certain Iranian sectors and reduction in support for trade and export credit assurances



Embargoes on arms and exports of products such as refined oil and gas to Iran



Travel ban on individuals and organisations involved in nuclear programmes – including Iranians studying abroad in nuclear-related disciplines

Freeze on bilateral political contacts
