

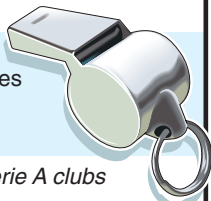
"Calciopoli" Italian football corruption trial

Italian fans will nervously await World Cup final weekend – when Italy's football federation (FIGC) is due to deliver its verdict on corruption charges levelled at four clubs and 26 senior figures within the game. Investigations into criminal association, share price rigging and fraud are also underway

FOOTBALL LEGAL CODE – ALLEGED VIOLATIONS

- Article 1** Violations of fairness and probity
- Article 2** Responsibility of club for actions of representatives
- Article 6** Sporting fraud – match fixing
- Article 9** Responsibility for actions of people outside club

May 2006: Magistrates allegedly intercept calls between Serie A clubs and FIGC officials – many discussing referee assignments



THE ACCUSED



1 2 6 9 **JUVENTUS:** Former general manager **Luciano Moggi** and former CEO **Antonio Giraudo** accused of manipulation and bribery of referees, including offering cut-price **Fiat** cars



1 2 **AC MILAN:** CEO **Adriano Galliani** – former president of Italian Football League – and executive **Leonardo Meani**



2 6 **FIORENTINA:** Owner **Diego Della Valle**, **Andrea Della Valle**, chairman, and director **Sandro Mencucci**



6 **REFEREES:** Ten officials including **Massimo De Santis**



6 **LAZIO:** Chairman **Claudio Lotito** – also under investigation for market-rigging

6 **FIGC:** Former president **Franco Carraro** and vice-president **Innocenzo Mazzini**, plus six officials responsible for referee assignments
