"Calciopoli" Italian football corruption trial

Italian fans will nervously await World Cup final weekend – when Italy's football federation (FIGC) is due to deliver its verdict on corruption charges levelled at four clubs and 26 senior figures within the game. Investigations into criminal association, share price rigging and fraud are also underway

Claudio Lotito – also under investigation for market-rigging
