Chief of staff: Commands 500-600 full-time fighters - in regular units of 20-30 - plus reserve militia of 2.500-3.000



Nabil Kauk

Commander of Southern Lebanon Controls field commanders

south of Litani River in Tyre, Nagoura, Nabatiyeh, Bint Jbail and Khiam

Field commanders

Instructed to act according to their own discretion if Security Square
