Katrina's hidden cost

The prevalence of mental illness among Hurricane Katrina survivors rose from 15% before the storm to about 31% after it. A study of 1,043 survivors by Harvard Medical School suggests 200,000 people from Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi face serious mental illness
