Lula on track for second term in Brazil

Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva holds a 14 point advantage ahead of Sunday's presidential election, despite a corruption scandal involving several highprofile members of his governing Worker's Party (PT). If no candidate garners 50 percent plus one vote, a run-off will take place on October 29
