UN Security Council

The 15-member Security Council has five veto-wielding permanent members and 10 non-permanent seats that are filled by regional groups for two-year stretches, five of them elected each year



- Permanent members: United States, Russia, China, UK, France
- Non-permanent members: Peru, Qatar, Congo Rep., Ghana and Slovenia hold seats until end of 2007. Italy, Belgium, Indonesia and South Africa appointed until end of 2008
- U.S. is lobbying against bid by Venezuela for tenth seat, backing Guatemala to raise two-thirds vote in 92-member General Assembly
