Up to 18 present and former Premier League managers are alleged to have taken illegal payments for player transfer deals

Almost 80 per cent of all transfers may be “bung”-assisted

- 1** Club pays fee to agent for arranging transfer of player
- 2** Agent illegally returns cut of often inflated fee to manager, scout, chief executive – or family member – as payment or “bung” for enabling deal
- 3** Money handed over in hard cash, into secret offshore accounts, or as other incentives, e.g. holidays

Lord Stevens' inquiry into illegal payments, including audit of all 362 transfers by 26 clubs from Jan 1, 2004 to Jan 31, 2006, due to reveal findings on Oct 2
