

On the poison trail of Litvinenko's killer

As British investigators await the results of an autopsy on the body of Alexander Litvinenko, a second man, who met with the former KGB agent on the day he fell ill, has tested positive for radioactive polonium-210

► **Oct 25:** Group of men, described by police as key witnesses, enter UK on flight from Moscow among soccer fans heading to **Arsenal-CSKA** match

► **Oct 31:** Former-KGB agent **Andrei Lugovoy** (left) flies in from Moscow to Heathrow with family to attend match

► **Nov 1:** Litvinenko leaves home and heads for central London, visiting four locations

1 **Itsu sushi bar:** Meets Italian academic and security consultant **Mario Scaramella**

2 **Millennium Hotel:** Meets Lugovoy and two other Russians, **Dmitri Kovtun** and **Vyacheslav Sokolenko**

3 **7 Down Street:** Office of self-exiled Russian tycoon and Kremlin critic **Boris Berezovsky** (right), who owns Muswell Hill home where Litvinenko family live

4 **25 Grosvenor Street:** Office of private security firm **Erinys International**

► **Nov 3:** Admitted to Barnet Hospital after two days of vomiting and diarrhoea



Litvinenko publicly accused Russian president **Vladimir Putin** of involvement in murder of Russian journalist **Anna Politkovskaya**, shot dead outside her Moscow apartment on Oct 7



► **Positive tests for polonium-210**
Nine London sites plus two aircraft



Heathrow airport: Investigation extended to five airliners, three from British Airways, flying between London and Moscow



► **Nov 17:** Transferred to University College Hospital, when condition worsens. Treated for suspected thallium poisoning

► **Nov 23:** Litvinenko dies. Scientists later confirm death due to polonium poisoning

► **Dec 1:** Scaramella (right) is second person to test positive for polonium-210
