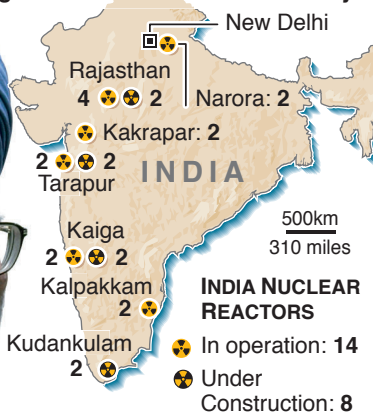


Bush signs India nuclear deal into law

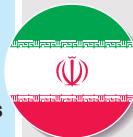
A deal agreed between President Bush and Indian Premier Manmohan Singh will allow the U.S. to sell nuclear technology to India. This reverses U.S. policy to restrict nuclear cooperation with Delhi because it has twice tested nuclear weapons and has not signed the Non-Proliferation Treaty



KEY PROVISIONS



India to get access to U.S. civil nuclear technology and fuel – deal could open up \$100bn in opportunities for U.S. businesses



U.S. insists India should cooperate with efforts to restrain Iran's nuclear ambitions – but India says any provision must be “non-binding”



India to bring 14 nuclear reactors used for civilian purposes under IAEA safeguards – eight military plants to remain off-limits



U.S. will stop all exports of nuclear materials if India conducts another nuclear test, as it did in 1974 and 1998
