Education: Spending to rise to £74bn by 2010/11. Student debt of £6bn to be sold off

NHS: To get an extra £8bn for investment and reform in England



**Business:** Corporation tax reduced from **30p** to **28p** from April 2008. Tax on small business raised to **22p** in the pound by 2009. Small businesses to get up to **£3,000** for training jobless young people. Extra **£6bn** to help people with bankrupt pension schemes



**Homes:** Capital gains tax allowance up from £8,800 to £9,200 this year. Allowance for married couples doubled. *Zero carbon* homes up to £500,000 in value to be exempt from stamp duty until 2012. Insulation grants worth up to £4,000 to be offered to pensioners



**Defence:** Extra £86m for security and counter-terrorism measures. Extra £400m for military operations in Iraq and Afghanistan



**VAT:** To be cut from **17.5%** to **5%** on environmental products for the home; building alterations to help elderly; and anti-smoking aids such as nicotine replacement products

Savings: Amount saved in an ISA up 20% to £3,600
