Key events of Benedict's papacy

Since taking office, Pope Benedict XVI has been faced with hot-button issues such as same-sex marriage, birth control, abortion, divorce, and religious instruction in schools, as well as a controversy over Islam

- Apr 19, 2005: Cardinal *Joseph*Ratzinger elected Pope
- Jun: Calls on Italians to boycott referendum seeking repeal of law on medically-assisted fertility. Vote defeated
- Aug: First foreign visit of his papacy is to Germany for *Catholic Youth Day*
- Sep: Criticises Canada for allowing same sex marriage and abortion
- Jan 25, 2006: Pontiff releases his first encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est God Is Love* which surprises with its positive references to erotic love, albeit clearly limited to heterosexual marriages
- Feb: Stance on Islam toughens with removal of highly respected Archbishop *Michael Fitzgerald* from post as president of *Pontifical Council for Inter-Religious Dialogue*. Experts suggest Fitzgerald is too soft on Islam
- Feb: Names 15 new cardinals.

- May: Excommunicates two Chinese bishops ordained without his approval
- Sep: Sparks protests throughout Muslim world by heavy-handedly quoting anti-Islamic remarks made by 14th century Byzantine Christian emperor *Paleologus* during lecture in Germany
- Nov: Visits Turkey, his first visit to a predominantly Muslim country. Protests continue over his anti-Islamic remarks
- Apr 2: Supports fast-track sainthood for *John Paul II* on second anniversary of his predecessor's death
- May 9-13: Pope to visit Brazil world's largest Roman Catholic country
