Bolivian deadline for Telecom Italia

Italy has asked the European Union to intervene to protect the investment of Telecom Italia SpA – Italy's biggest phone company – in its Entel Bolivia unit after the Latin American country moved to nationalize telecommunication services

- ▶ Jan 22, 2006: Leftist President *Evo Morales* sworn in, pledging to empower Bolivia's poor, indigenous majority
- Mar: Bolivia says it will not renew three-year deal with International Monetary Fund after decades of IMF-imposed austerity programmes

May 1: Morales orders military to occupy oil and gas fields and refineries.

Ten foreign oil companies agree to accept higher tax rates, adding \$750 million a year to state coffers

- ▶ Jun: Brazil agrees to pay 10% more for Bolivian natural gas, and Argentina almost 50% more
- Apr 2007: New decree allows
 Morales to force two foreign-owned
 pension funds to cede control of
 47% interest in telecommunications
 company Entel to state
- May 1: Deadline for Telecom Italia to sell its controlling 50% stake in Entel to state
