Abu Ayyub al-Masri factfile

- 1965-66: Sheikh Abu Ayyub al-Masri, also known as Abu Hamza al-Muhajir, born in Egypt
- 1982: Joins
 Egyptian Islamic
 Jihad, led by
 al-Qaeda number two
 Ayman al-Zawahiri
- 1992-95: Works and lives in Khartoum, Sudan, with *Osama* bin Laden
- 1995: Moves to Peshawar, Pakistan
- 1999: Travels to al-Farouq training camp near Kandahar, Afghanistan, where he meets Jordanian militant Abu Musab al-Zarqawi. Al-Masri becomes expert in making explosives and roadside bombs
- **2002:** Works with al-Zarqawi and **Ansar al-Islam** group in northern Iraq



- 2003: Becomes chief of al-Qaeda's recruitment and intelligence arm in Iraq, travelling throughout Middle East and North Africa
- **2004:** Moves to Kirkuk during siege of Fallujah by U.S. Marines
- **2006:** U.S. puts \$5-million bounty on al-Masri's head
- June: Al-Masri becomes leader of
- al-Qaeda in Iraq after al-Zarqawi is killed in U.S. air strike
- **2007:** Friction grows between Sunni groups over al-Qaeda's indiscriminate killing of civilians and imposition of austere *Salafi-Jihadist* brand of Islam
- May 1: Al-Masri reported killed by Sunni tribesmen in Baghdad
