Resigns as *President of World Bank* following scandal over \$193,000-plus pay and promotion deal for his girlfriend. President *George W. Bush* nominated his former Deputy Defence Secretary to head World Bank in 2005

■ George Tenet: CIA director resigns under criticism of his notorious pre-war report that *Saddam Hussein's* possession of weapons of mass destruction was a "slam-dunk". No WMD have ever been found

and lying to FBI over

Valerie Plame's identity.



Plame's husband, former Ambassador *Joseph Wilson*, had publicly disputed statements made by President Bush justifying war in Iraq

Porter Goss: After replacing Tenet, CIA head mysteriously dumped by Bush. Spreading corruption and sex scandal allegedly links CIA officials, defence contractors, disgraced Republican congressman *Duke Cunningham* and other lawmakers

John Bolton: Steps down as Bush's nominee as U.S. ambassador to United Nations after bruising fight
