## **Biafra: Icon of starvation and suffering**

In 1967, an obscure corner of Africa introduced the world to the civil wars and starving children that would become recurring hallmarks of the continent's troubles. Forty years on, Biafra remains an issue threatening to disrupt Nigeria's fragile ethnic and religious balance

Four ethnic groups account for more than two-thirds of Nigeria's total population

- ▶ 1966: Military coup and counter-coup spark riots and massacres of *lbo* people in southeast
- May 30, 1967: Governor of Ibo-dominated region declares *Biafra* an independent state

- ▶ Jan 14, 1970: After fierce fighting, besieged Biafran army surrenders to Nigerian forces
- ▶ 1971: International aid agency *Médecins*Sans Frontières created out of Biafra suffering

As many as three million people may have died, mostly from hunger after food aid was blocked
