TREATY	PARTIES / PROVISIONS	STATUS
<b>1972</b> Anti-Ballistic Missile (ABM)	U.S., Soviet Union. Restricts missile sites to two per nation	<b>U.S. withdrew in 2002</b>
<b>1987</b> Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces (INF)	U.S., Soviet Union. Bans ground-launched ballistic and cruise missiles in 500-5,500km range	<b>Russia threatening to withdraw</b>
<b>1990</b> Conventional Forces in Europe (CFE)	NATO, former Warsaw Pact. Limits ground and air forces	<b>Russia threatens moratorium</b>
<b>1991</b> Strategic Arms Reduction (START I)	U.S., Soviet Union. Nuclear arsenals cut by 9,000 warheads	<b>Expires 2009</b>
<b>1993</b> START II	U.S., Russia. Nuclear forces cut by 5,000 warheads. Use of land-based multiple warheads banned	<b>Russia withdrew in 2002</b>
<b>2002</b> Strategic Offensive Reductions (SORT)	U.S., Russia. Further limits nuclear arsenal to 1,700-2,200 operationally deployed warheads	<b>Expires 2012</b>
